Global Skills Forum (GSF) 2025 puts the private sector at the centre of international skills transformation, aligning with Malaysia's ASEAN Chairmanship and the ASEAN Year of Skills (AYOS) 2025. This collaborative effort with the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the International Organisation of Employers (IOE) is hosted in Malaysia by the Human Resource Development Corporation (HRD Corp) under the Ministry of Human Resources Malaysia (KESUMA).

Following the successful launch of the Global Skills Forum in Geneva in 2024, the 2025 edition promises to be even more impactful, catalysing global collaboration and innovation in skills development. It offers a unique opportunity to reimagine how industries can help shape agile, demand-driven and human-centred workforce strategies.
